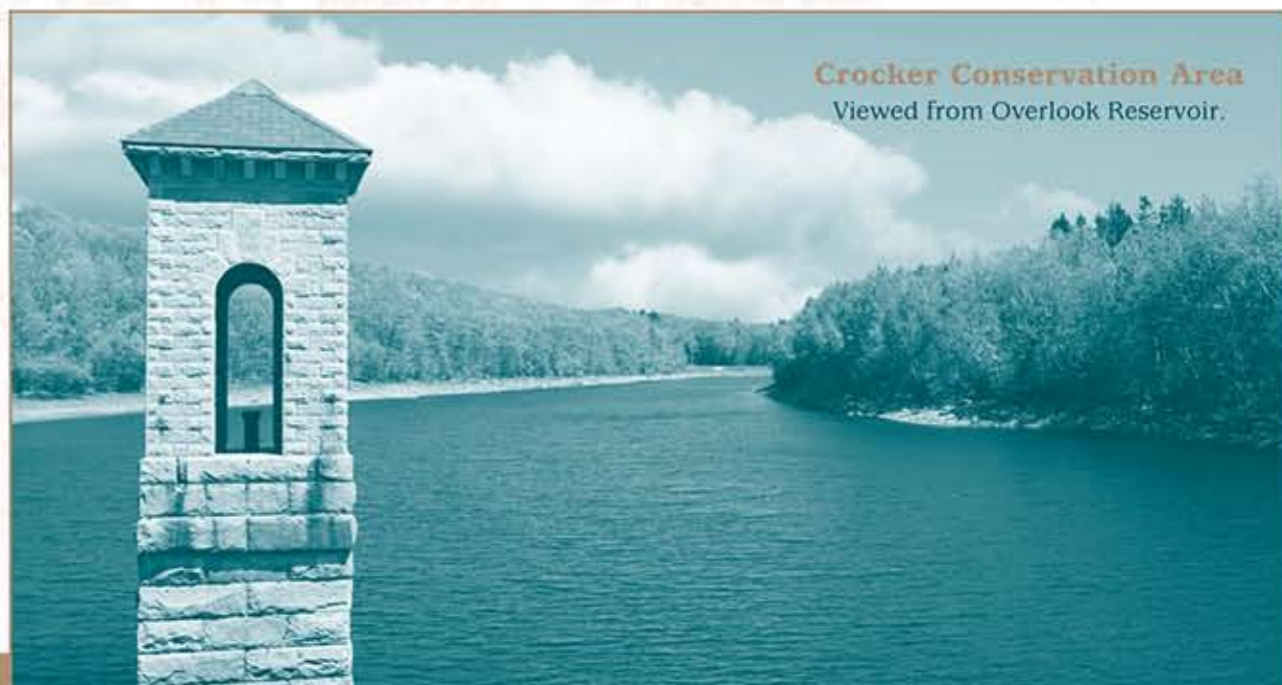

A Conservation Restriction... eliminates the right to develop land, but it does not change its ownership. A conservation restriction does not require public access to the land. The landowner may continue to use the land after the conservation restriction is placed on it.

NCLT's Crocker Conservation Area is a 150-acre wooded parcel which can be accessed within 1/2 mile of Fitchburg's urban center. Crocker Conservation Area is the keystone of a large open space area adjacent to Audubon's Flatrock Wildlife Sanctuary and over one thousand acres of reservoirs and watershed land.
