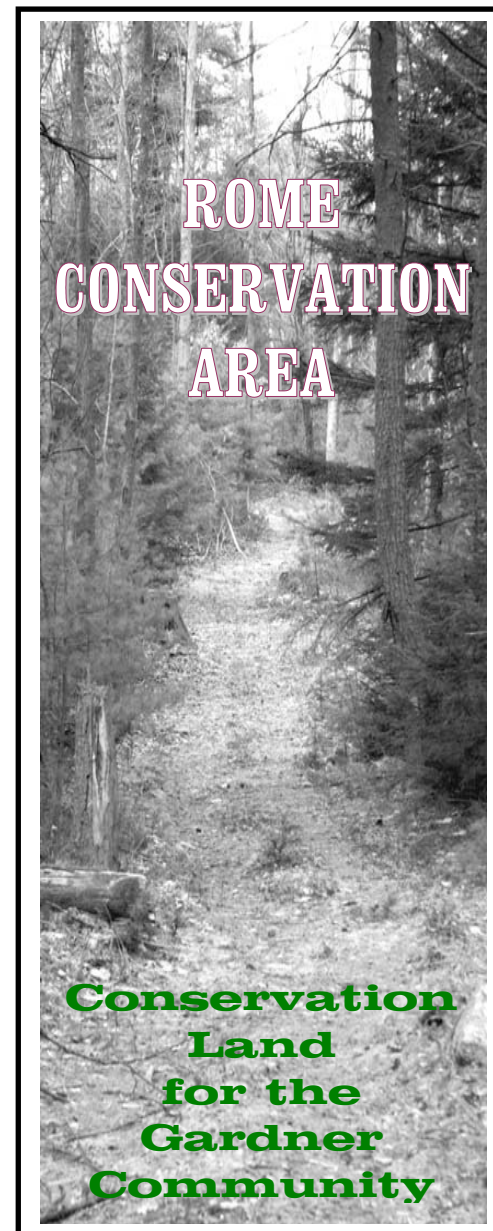

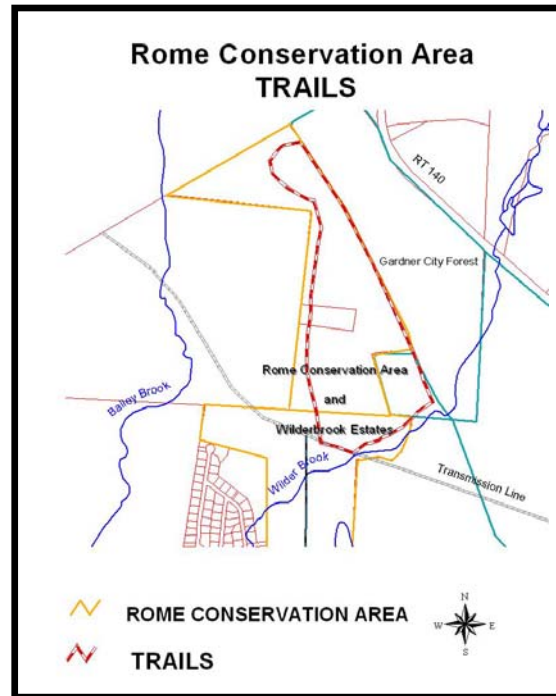
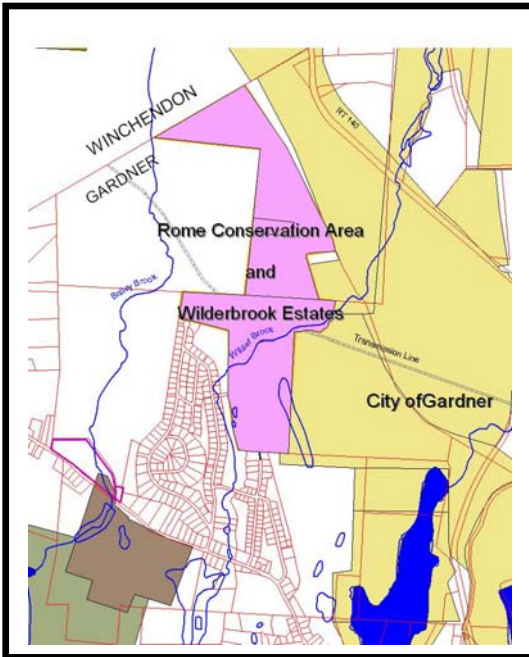


Rome Conservation Area was founded in 2002, with a gift of 175 acres from the Rome family to the North County Land Trust, Inc.

The conservation land is a mixed hardwood/conifer forest drained by Wilder Brook. It is bounded on the north by the Winchendon town line and on the east by the Gardner City Forest.

Rome CA is protected by a Conservation Restriction held by Massachusetts Department of Conservation & Recreation.
